Answer:

The project developed out of the experience of my first visit to Lima with Cuauhtémoc Medina, curator from Mexico for the Lima Biennal, in october 2000. This was during the last months of the Fujimori dictatorship. Lima was in turmoil with clashes on the street, open social tension and an emerging movement of resistance. This was a desperate situation calling for an epical response: infiltrating a social allegory within that circumstance seemed more fitting to me than engaging in a sculpture exercise. An also as Cuauhtémoc said (his eyes glancing at his Pisco) "Faith is a means by which one resigns in the present to invest into an abstract future promise."
